"America and Its Guns – A Theological Exposé" There have been more than 130 separate school shootings since Columbine. How did we get here? How did we evolve under the rubrics of "gun rights" and "freedom" so that each of us knows there will be another school shooting or mass killing with assault weapons; and we know there is not yet the political or spiritual will to prevent these deaths. Jim Atwood, author of <i>America and Its Guns – A Theological Exposé</i> and chairperson of the DC "Heeding God's Call," contends that the gun deaths America suffers every year cannot be understood apart from our national myth that God has appointed America as "the trustee of the civilization of the world" and even "Christ's light to the nations." We will examine our history, our fascination with violence, and our language which is full of violent terms. We will explore how our guns have morphed into idols where millions not only respect them but revere them. Our final session will focus on the responsibility of the faith community to building Christ's "Peaceable Kingdom." The book will be available from the Church Office for \$10.






The flowers in the chancel today are given to the glory of God and in memory of loved ones and friends by members and friends of the Congregation through their contributions to the Flower Fund.
