I. The Community Gathers for Worship

Welcome Narrator 1 (Julia)
Welcome to all! Happy or sad, rejoicing or grieving, seeking or believing. Welcome to all, here is good news: To you is born this day, in the city of David, a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. His name is Jesus; "Liberator," "Rescuer," "Deliverer." His life changed the world. His living presence changes us today. Lift up your hearts. Rejoice! Give thanks to God.

*The Lighting of Advent Candles **The Candle of Joy**

Leader: Prepare the way of the Lord! We lit the first two candles for hope and peace. Now we light this candle for joy, the joy that we have in Jesus our Savior.

All: The prophet Isaiah speaks: The Spirit of the Living God is upon me because God has chosen me...to announce good news to the humble, to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, to release those in prison, to comfort those who mourn, to give them garlands instead of ashes, oil instead of mourner's tears.

Leader: In a season full of so much to do, instead of fear and anxiety, we listen to the words of the angels to the shepherds keeping watch over their flocks by night: *Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy of all the people.* Through JOY, we share the good news: *Go and tell what you have seen and heard, the poor receive good news, and the dead are raised to new life.*

All: God of all creation, you bring forth flowers in the desert and water in a weary land. Open our hearts that we may know your presence and believe. Amen.

Call to Worship Angel Visits Mary ~ Luke 1: 26-38

Narrator 2: One day, an angel appeared to a young woman named Mary. *(Olivia)*

Angel: Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you. Do not be afraid, for you have found favor with God. You will conceive and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and called the Son of the Most High!” *(David)*

Mary: How can this be? *(Beth and Narrator 2)*

Angel and Congregation: **God will send the Holy Spirit to give you this baby and therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. God has also done another miracle. After many years of waiting, God will give your relatives Elizabeth and Zechariah a son. For nothing is impossible with God!**

Mary: I am God’s humble servant. Let it be according to your word. *(also Narrator 2)*

Reading Mary Visits Elizabeth ~ Luke 1:39-49

Narrator 2: Mary quickly left to visit Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary’s greeting, the child leaped in her womb and she was filled with the Holy Spirit.

Elizabeth: Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb! You are full of grace to believe that what the angel told you would come true! *(Liz)*

Mary: My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God, for he has looked on a lowly servant with favor. All generations will call me blessed! Holy is God’s name! *(also Narrator 2)*

***Prayer of Confession** Joseph's Dream

Joseph: When I found out that Mary was pregnant before we were to be married, I planned to dismiss her quietly because I wanted to do the right thing and didn’t want to publicly humiliate her. *(Jack)*

Congregation: **We confess that we are not open to Your miracles, O God. We do not open our eyes to Your possibilities in our lives. We exclude and judge those who do not adhere to the norms of our society and struggle to find You in our world.**

Narrator 2: In exhaustion and concern, Joseph fell asleep. That night, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream.

***Assurance of Pardon**

Angel: Do not be afraid! For the child conceived in Mary is from the Holy Spirit. This child shall be called Jesus and he will save his people from their sins.

Congregation: **All this took place to fulfill what has been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: “Look the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call him Emmanuel, which means, God is with us.”**

Reading The Visit of the Wise Men ~ Matthew 2:1-2

Narrator 4: Sometime after Jesus was born, three wise men journeyed to Jerusalem. They had carefully studied the stars to learn that a King had been born in that region. They stopped at King Herod’s palace. *(Astrid)*

Gold Wise Man: Where is the newborn King? *(Aidan)*

Frankincense Wise Man: We have seen the bright star and know that he is to be King of the Jews. *(Sam)*

Myrrh Wise Man: We want to worship him. *(Philip)*

Narrator 5: But King Herod did not like this news. *He* was King of the Jews! *(Jacob)*
