Call to Worship

Leader: There are five candles in our ring. In expectation of this Holy day, we have lit one each week of Advent. These candles connect us with generations who have come long before us. These are the candles that bring us together as we seek to be in relationship with one another. These candles shine reminding us of God's light that shines in the darkness.

All: Living Christ, light of the world, give us the warmth of Your love.

Leader: We lit the first candle for Hope as a prayer in our suffering world, that God may be revealed to all.

All: Living God, come into our world this Holy night.

Leader: We lit the second candle for Peace to celebrate the promise of the prophets: "Comfort my people, bring comfort to them, says Your God." "Love and faithfulness will come together. Justice and peace will embrace."

All: Living God, come into our world this Holy night.

Leader: We lit the third candle for Joy, the joy of a people waiting for the Prince of Peace, Emmanuel, Savior and Lord to us all.

All: Living God, come into our world this Holy night.

Leader: We lit the fourth candle as a sign of God's abounding Love, shining in the world through people past and present.

All: Living God, come into our world this Holy night.

Leader: Tonight, in a world full of violence and despair, in a world that prays for the coming of peace, on this Holy night we light the Christ Candle to celebrate Jesus Christ, God incarnate, God who is with us. We light the Christ candle, thankful that God has come to us, not as a conquering hero but as a child, whose faithful, peaceful life will follow God's way of Love.

All: Living God, come to our world. May the love of Christ shine brightly, at the center of our lives, spreading warmth and light, in us, in this church and everywhere. Amen.
